1. THE EVENT

The event, a Multi-Club Khanacross, shall be known as the GMSC & WDCC Avalon Autocross/Khanacross Series Round 5, and will hereafter be called the Event. The Event will be held on the 15/07/2012, which will be hereafter called "the Sunday of the Event". The Event is open to members of clubs affiliated with CAMS in Victoria.

4. OFFICIALS

Note that the above designated officials will be considered the Judges of Fact for all matters pertaining to the Event.

5. AUTHORITY

The event will be held under the International Sporting Code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), the Khanacross Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any further regulations or instructions issued. The event will be held under and in accordance with the CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found at www.cams.com.au.

6. PLACE AND DATE

The event will be held at the "Geelong Motor Sports Complex" (gravel surface), on the Sunday of the Event at the corner of the Princess Hwy & Beach Rd Avalon. Current CAMS Affiliated Club Membership Card, CAMS licence, and CAMS vehicle log book (if issued) <u>MUST</u> be presented at scrutiny. Scrutiny will commence at 8.30 am **AND CLOSE AT 9.45am**. A compulsory Drivers briefing will be at 10.00 am. Official runs will commence at 10.30 am. Catering will be available. This event will be a round of the CAMS Junior Pentathlon Series

You MUST be in the queue for Scrutiny by 9.00am.

7. ENTRIES

- (a) Entries will open 2 July and close at 10.00 am on the Sunday of the Event. Entries are to be lodged with the Event Secretary via phone or e-mail. Cheques or money orders should be made payable to "WDCC & GMSC"
- (b) The entry fee is \$35.00 for drivers aged 18 years before the 1st of February, or over, and \$15.00 for class J entries aged 12 up to 18 years. Drivers aged 12 and 13 years must be accompanied by an experienced instructor as approved by the Clerk of Course.
- (c) An entry will only be termed valid when a current CAMS license, club membership and vehicle logbook is presented, and payment has been received with a signed entry form.
- (d) There will be a maximum of four drivers per vehicle
- (e) A maximum of 55 entries will be accepted, in order of receipt
- (f) The Promoter reserves the right to refuse entries in accordance with NCR83.

8. INSURANCE

- (a) Combined liability insurance has been effected by the Promoters.
- (b) All drivers and officials are covered by the CAMS personal accident insurance.
- (c) For further details, refer to Appendix I of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport.

9. CLASSES

A - up to 1300cc standard, B - 1301 to 1600cc standard

C - 1601 to 2000cc standard, D - over 2000cc standard

E-up to 1300cc modified, F-1301 to 1600cc modified

G – 1601 to 2000cc modified, H – over 2000cc modified

J – Junior (14 to 18 y.o.), K – Females

L - Specials and 4 wheel drive

10. STARTING ORDER

Starting order will be determined by ballot. In the case of shared vehicles, drivers will be spaced several vehicles apart to allow changeovers with minimal disruption to the event.

11. DRIVERS

- (a) Drivers must hold a CAMS level 2NS/2NSJ Licence or superior.
- (b) All competitors are required to wear snug fitting clothes covering the body from neck to wrist to ankles and suitable footwear. Clothing should be of a fire resistant nature. For further details, please refer to Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

12. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

Vehicles must comply with Schedule A & Group 4H Motorkhana Cars of the CAMS Manual.

13. SPECIAL NOTES.

- (1) **All vehicles** must utilize two separate fastening systems on any front opening panel.
- (2) **Fire extinguishers** to a standard listed in Schedule H of the current CAMS manual must be securely fitted to the vehicle.
- (3) **Safety helmets** must conform to schedule D requirements (e.g. AS 1698) and be worn whilst competing.
- (4) **All competitors** are required to wear snug fitting clothes covering the body from neck to wrist to ankles and suitable footwear. Clothing should be of a fire resistant nature and comply with Schedule D of the 2012 CAMS Manual of Motorsport.
- (5) **All vehicles**: (a) Reconditioned tyres may be permitted at the discretion of the Scrutineers. Off road, rally or winter tread tyres are <u>not</u> permitted. Tyres with a square shoulder are prohibited. (b) Tubeless tyres must be fitted to optimum rim size only. (c) Vehicles must have on their coachwork a triangle of 150mm sides indicating the battery location. (d) Mud flaps must be fitted to the driving wheels. (e) Must be fitted with front and rear towing hooks.
- (6) Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS manual.
- (7) All cars must be adequately muffled.

Any breaches of these Supplementary Regulations will be dealt with in the same manner as breaches of all other regulations pertaining to the event.

14. EVENT LAYOUT

- (a) The event will consist of at least six (6) tests with each test no greater than 1.5 km in length.
- (b) No more than two (2) vehicles will be permitted on a course at any one time as per the Khanacross Standing Regulations 1.1.

15. RUNNING DETAIL

Results will be determined by adding the competitor's runs. The number of runs will be determined by the clerk of course and be dependent on the condition of the track (typically 6 runs). Timing will be by hand held stop watches. Time starts and finishes when the front of the vehicle passes the start/finish line. This is a Series event and points will be awarded to the end of year tally.

16. STARTING PROCEDURE

Competitors will line up in numerical order and will move into the start garage when signaled by either the green light or the start marshal.

17. FINISH PROCEDURE

A run is completed once the competitor has come to a complete halt within the finish garage. Vehicles are then to proceed immediately off the course. The maximum speed limit in the paddock area is 10 km/h.

18. TERMINATION, POSTPONEMENT OR ABANDONMENT OR CANCELLATION

The organisers reserve the right to stop the event at any time if they consider it necessary, in the interests of safety or for any other reason.

In the event of a **Total Fire Ban** being declared or **heavy rain**, the event **WILL** be cancelled.

The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon, or cancel the event under NCR 59, and if the event is cancelled or postponed prior to commencement for more than 24 hours, the entry fees shall be refunded in full. Organisers also reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR83.

19. AWARDS

1st, 2nd, and 3rd Outright - Trophies
1st in each class (min 3 entries/class) - Trophy

20. ANTI DOPING POLICY

During any event, consumption of alcoholic beverages in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue under the control of the officials is expressly forbidden until all practice or competition activity is concluded for each day. Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A of the Current CAMS Manual. In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS Drugs in Sport Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) or other drugs at any time during the event(s).

The CAMS Anti Doping Policy, as appears in the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport and as amended from time to time, is recognised as an integral component of the NCR and is duly authorised as such.

In any areas where the National Competition Rules and the CAMS Anti Doping Policy conflict, the CAMS Anti Doping Policy will take precedence.

21. PENALTIES

See section 4 of the Standing Regulations.

Five (5) seconds will be added to your time for crashing after the finish line.

22. PROTESTS

Protests must be lodged in accordance with part XII of the NCR's and accompanied by the appropriate fee.
